Science

This half term we are looking at some animal classifications and animal diets...

**MAMMALS**

- give birth to live young.
- have hair or fur
- mammal mothers nurse their young with milk.
- **Warm-blooded**

**REPTILES**

- have scales, not fur.
- they have dry skin.
- usually lay eggs, sometimes live young
- **Cold-blooded.**

**AMPHIBIANS**

- live on land & in water.
- **Cold-blooded.**
- lay eggs.
- moist skin.
- webbed feet.

Word	Definition	
<b>mammals</b>	warm-blooded animals such as cats, cows, dogs and pigs	
<b>amphibians</b>	cold-blooded animals such as frogs, toads and newts	
<b>reptiles</b>	cold-blooded animals such as snakes, lizards and crocodiles	
<b>live young</b>	a baby that is not hatched from an egg	
<b>nurse</b>	the method by which newborn mammals are nourished	

**OMNIVORES**  
These are animals able to eat plants AND animals.  
Some omnivores are:  
• humans  
• most bears  
• raccoons  
• most primates (apes & monkeys)  
• seagulls & other birds

**HERBIVORES**  
These are animals that eat mainly plants.  
This includes leaves, grass, flowers, seeds, roots, fruits, bark, pollen and much more.  
Some herbivores are:  
• deer  
• horses  
• rabbits  
• cows  
• bees  
• sheep  
• grasshoppers

**CARNIVORES**  
These are animals that eat mainly meat.  
This includes insects and all animals.  
Some carnivores are:  
• felines (lions, tigers & all cats)  
• birds of prey (eagles, hawks, owls etc)  
• sharks  
• frogs  
• spiders

Word	Definition	
<b>omnivores</b>	animals that eat both meat and plants	
<b>herbivores</b>	animals that only eat plants	
<b>carnivores</b>	animals that only eat meat	
<b>meat</b>	flesh of an animal or an insect	
<b>plants</b>	living things such as trees and plants

This term we will be looking at **Christianity**..




word	definition
