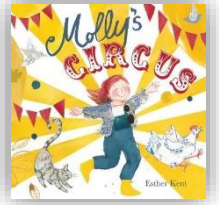





W/C 21th February, we will be sharing the story:

Our key vocabulary for the week will be:

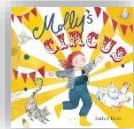
