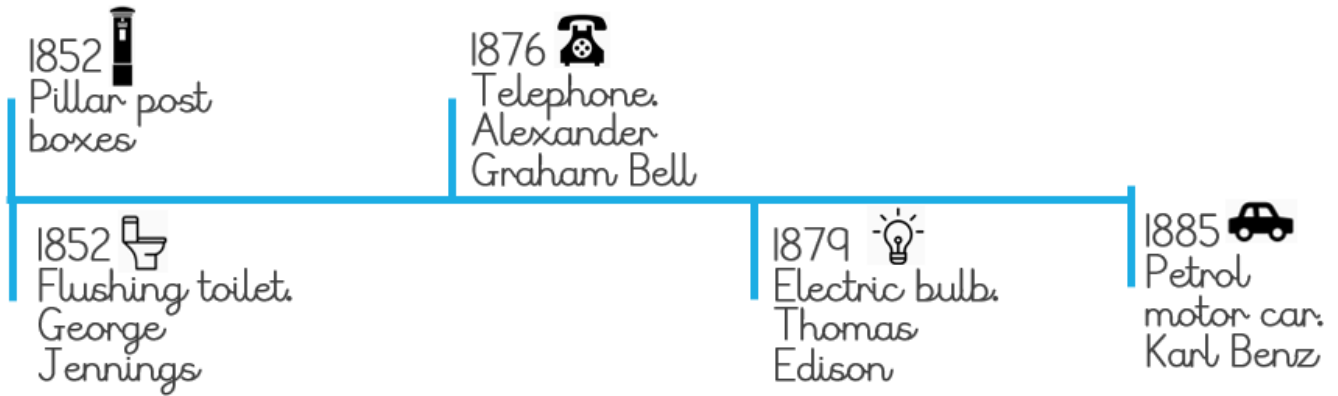

Pulse

Dimensions of music

- He designed the Clifton Suspension Bridge in Bristol.
