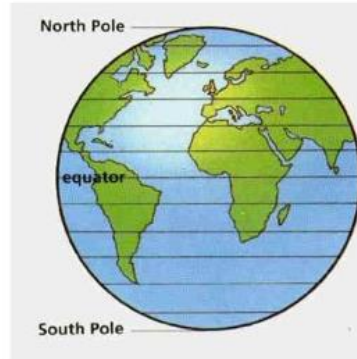


Geography

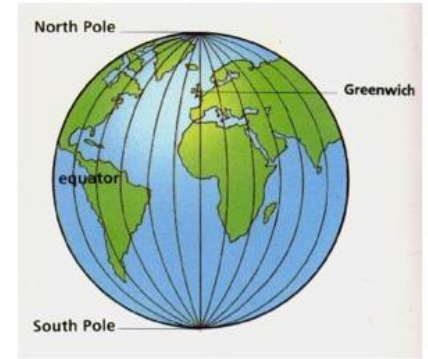
The world is divided into two parts by the **equator**.

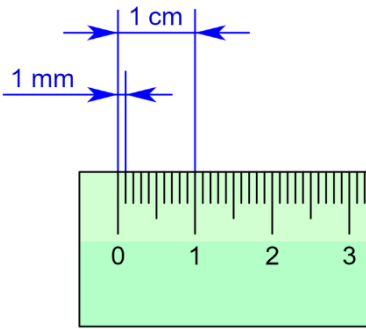


Vocabulary

Word	Definition	Picture
transition	The process of passing from one stage to another. <i>In July, we will begin our transition to year 4.</i>	
equator	The imaginary line around the middle of the Earth. <i>The equator divides the Earth into a Northern and Southern Hemisphere.</i>	
coordination	The working together of different muscles to carry out a complicated movement. <i>Athletes usually have good coordination.</i>	
reflection	The return of light from a surface. <i>An image produced in a mirror like item is called a reflection.</i>	
source	Someone or something that provides what is needed. <i>A torch is an example of a light source.</i>

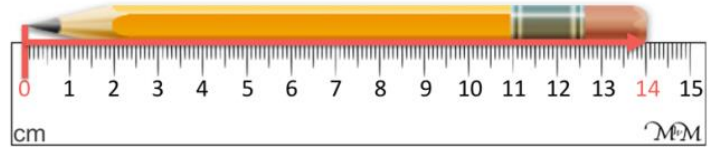
10mm = 1cm

Millimeters (mm)

As a very general rule, you should measure **small objects** in **millimetres** or **centimetres** and **bigger lengths** in **metres**.



- mm = millimetres** A millimetre is about the width of a sewing needle.
- cm = centimetres** A centimetre is roughly the width of a finger.
- m = metres** A metre is about the length of a person's

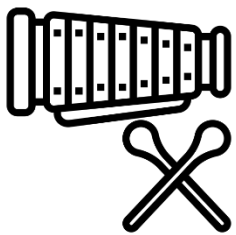
